Qualifications

- **Degree/Education:** Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) or Doctor of Osteopathy (D.O.). Must have completed clinical internship and residency. Fellowship training preferred.
- Board Certification: Current board certification in Aerospace Medicine.
- Licensure: Possess and Maintain valid, full, active, unrestricted U.S Medical License.
- Experience: The applicant must have a minimum 3 years in the last 10 years of active duty US. Military Flight Surgeon experience. Applicant must have a minimum of 5 years' experience in Air Force medical standards to conduct special operational evaluations, including (but not limited to) PHA for flyers/special duty personnel, initial certification exams for flying/special duty applicants. Aeromedical disposition for flying/special operational duty. Conducting adaptability rating assessment for military special duty applicants. Applying medical, fitness and profiling standards IAW AFIs 48-123, 36-2905 and 10-203 (including profiling and duty restrictions as Profile Officer).

Duties:

The primary purpose of this contract is Provide Aerospace Medicine Physicians/Providers on a rotational/ temporary basis to any of the 11 AETC Medical Treatment Facilities/AETC units. This position directly supports Aerospace Medicine Dispositions and Flying Training Waivers for all AETC Flying Training Programs. This process may require but is not limited to chart review, review of additional medical documents, support with investigations, coordination with civilian and military medical providers, coordination with submission sources



within the line of the Air Force, coordination with higher headquarters (HAF/SG), and consultation with the Aeromedical Consultation Service (ACS) at the USAF School of Aerospace Medicine (USAFASAM). Further duties include accomplishing medical evaluation and adjudication of medical requirements and waivers specifically related to accessions waivers, medical examinations, health assessments, physical evaluation, fitness for duty and disability determinations on various types of cases, and other similar physical medical cases submitted to AETC/SGPS for determination and action. This includes assistance in formulation of responses and dispositions to individual cases as well as making recommendations for development of policies that guide the decisions which are ultimately made by the SG director. Contracted personnel may provide strategic direction project planning and scheduling development and general administrative support functions which may include tasking support functions, consultation functions, meeting attendance, briefing development and support and other such duties as directed within the scope of the contract.
